The chairman of the Cort Adeler Society gave on Friday to Mads Bøttger, the owner of Dragsholm Castle, an honorific testimony to honor the castle's development.



Both of them had to go the castle's chapel where there is a portrait of Cort Adeler.

The name Adeler is close attached to the history of Dragsholm castle, from Cort Adeler, who was a danish-norwegian seaofficer and especially from his son Frederik Christian Adeler, who restaured the castle in 1697 to make it again as a unique baroque castle, and in 1785 the castle was baptised to Adelersborg until the feudatary baron Georg Frederik Otto Zypten-Adeler in 1868 used again the name of Dragsholm Slot

The name Adeler is still honored in Norway, at least at the Cort Adeler Society whose chairman was in the castle on Friday to give the owner, Mads Bøttger, the Society's plaquette. This took place also in the castle's chapel under the portrait of Cort Adeler.

During the last years, the chairman of the Society, Rune Engen-Glug, has been living several times in the castle, and both he and the Adeler Society have been following the development of the castle.

And they must have liked what they saw. In any case, the board of the Cort Adeler Society decided to give the castle a testimony of honour in form of a plaquette which will be hung in the castle.

The chairman of the Cort Adeler Society came to Dragsholm castle from Brevik in Norway, and it was a proud castleowner who received this sign of honour which once again reminds us about the historical significance of the castle.
